Justice Education Fellowship 2024-25

What is OJEN? What is the Justice Education Fellowship?

The [Ontario Justice Education Network \(OJEN\)](#) invites applications from Ontario paralegal students and law school students for its Justice Education Fellowships.

OJEN is a charitable not-for-profit, non-governmental organization with a province-wide mandate. We develop innovative educational tools that introduce young people to the justice system, help them understand the law, and build their legal capability. We work to help prepare young people to manage the legal aspects of problems that arise in their own lives. Our programs are delivered across Ontario by a staff of 14 and a pool of approximately 1200 justice sector volunteers, including judges, lawyers, paralegals, police officers, and students.

OJEN's Justice Education Fellowships expand the reach of our [mandate and mission](#) and public legal education (PLEI) programs, allowing us to offer in-depth PLEI training to a select group of paralegal students and law students. This will include focused skill development in communications, community outreach, public speaking, and plain language work. Fellows then go on to deliver programs to high-school students across the province.

Here's what you need to know:

Fellows will be expected to:

- Coordinate and facilitate a minimum of three (3) justice education programs for youth during the Fellowship period using OJEN's program templates OR create one (1) customized justice education program with the guidance of Fellowship supervisors;
- Communicate regularly with Fellowship supervisors;
- Participate in group check-in and/or professional development calls;
- Complete training and professional development activities as assigned, including a two-day intensive training in the summer;
- Volunteer to sit on OJEN's local justice education committee if one exists in the local area; and
- Collect and report evaluation data on local justice education programs.

Justice Education Fellowship 2024-25

Fellowship Period: May 1, 2024 – May 1, 2025

Eligibility:

1. Applicants must be registered students at an Ontario college in a paralegal certificate program or an Ontario law school in the 2024–2025 academic year.
2. All applicants are required to attend an in-person training session in Toronto over two days in the summer. Training dates will be shared with applicants after the interview process. (OJEN may offer subsidies for travel and accommodations if needed).

Positions Available:

- One (1) Fellowship will be offered to one student from each eligible Ontario law school.
- Two (2) Fellowships will be offered to two students at Ontario colleges with an accredited paralegal certificate program.

Compensation: \$1,000 honorarium

Application Deadline: Friday, March 15, 2024, by 5:00 p.m.

A small number of candidates will be selected for an interview. Interviews will take place by Zoom between **March 18 – March 29, 2024**.
